CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT POLICY

All employees of AcadeMir Charter School Elementary South, as well as agents of AcadeMir Charter Schools, Inc., are legally required to report any suspected cases of child abuse, abandonment, or neglect. Additionally, any alleged misconduct by instructional personnel or school administrators that affects the health, safety, or welfare of a student must be reported.

It is the responsibility of every staff member to report suspected abuse to the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) by calling **1-800-96-ABUSE**. Staff members must also inform school administration to ensure appropriate follow-up. Any incident involving alleged abuse by a staff member must be reported both to the administration and to DCF.

All reports must be documented in the staff member's anecdotal records, and the phone call must be logged accordingly.

Possible indicators of abuse may include, but are not limited to:

- Unexplained bruises or welts
- Unexplained burns
- Unexplained fractures
- Unexplained cuts or abrasions

Verbal abuse or threats

Failure to report suspected abuse or misconduct may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment and revocation of an educator's certificate.

What Parents Need to Know About Bullying

What is Bullying?

A student is bullied when they are repeatedly subjected to negative actions by one or more peers. (Olweus, 1993)

What is Cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying involves using technology (internet, cell phones, digital platforms) to embarrass, threaten, or intimidate others in an attempt to gain power. (Stutzky, 2005)

How Does Bullying Affect Children?

- Disrupts learning
- Creates a climate of fear and disrespect
- Undermines emotional well-being (National Education Association, 2003)
- If you suspect your child is being bullied, contact their counselor or school administrator immediately for support.
